- A Mātauranga Māori Roundtable:
 - The iwi / hapū of Tīkapa Moana / Te Moananui ā Toi and its catchments are Mana Whenua of their respective rohe.
 - Mana Whenua are mana whakahaere of Tīkapa Moana / Te Moananui ā Toi



Members include:

- Tangata Tiaki – Mana Whenua o Tikapa Moana / Te Moananui a Toi
- Technical Support



- Provides a space for discussions around Mana Whenua contributions for each of the six key issues,
- Provides a space for Mana Whenua to discuss and debate potential: issues, policies and methods that are Mātauranga Māori informed,
- Will engage with experts (mātauranga Māori) and other policy officials (council and iwi/hapū) for each of the issues



Mana Whakahaere

Decision Making Authority

- Recognition of Mana Whenua property rights, e.g. customary and Treaty of Waitangi rights
- Co-governance, co-management and co-planning approach

Mana Whenua Vision

- Kia mau ki te mauri o te Taiao o Tīkapa Moana, Te Moananui a Toi – Enhance the mauri of the Hauraki Gulf



- Take Matua: Key Issue
 - Integrated catchment management, “ki uta, ki tai” (mountains to sea), is a holistic way for managing ecosystems within Tīkapa Moana / Te Moananui a Toi and is grounded in tikanga Māori
 - Whāinga: Objective e.g.
 - The mauri of marine, estuarine and freshwater in Tīkapa Moana / Te Moananui ā Toi is restored, protected and enhanced





- Take Matua: Key Issue
 - Tīkapa Moana / Te Moananui ā Toi is recognised as a mahinga kai and a pātaka kai
 - a food basket that meets the spiritual and physical needs of Mana Whenua
 - Whāinga: Objective e.g.
 - Taonga species are protected and enhanced to give effect to the exercise of mana whakahaere





- Take Matua: Key Issue
 - Tīkapa Moana / Te Moananui ā Toi is recognised as a mahinga kai and a pātaka kai
 - a food basket that meets the spiritual and physical needs of Mana Whenua
 - Whāinga: Objective e.g.
 - Mana Whenua can provide for whānau and fulfill manaakitanga obligations





- Take Matua: Key Issue
 - The protection of indigenous flora and fauna species as well as taonga species is important to the kaitiaki role of Mana Whenua
 - Whāinga: Objective e.g.
 - Taonga species and their habitats are protected, restored, enhanced and managed, consistent with the tikanga, mātauranga, and mana whakahaere of Mana Whenua





- Take Matua: Key Issue
 - Access to Tīkapa Moana / Te Moananui a Toi is essential for ensuring Mana Whenua wellbeing
 - Whāinga: Objective e.g.
 - Mana Whenua access to Tīkapa Moana / Te Moananui ā Toi coastal and marine areas for customary activities is protected and enhanced





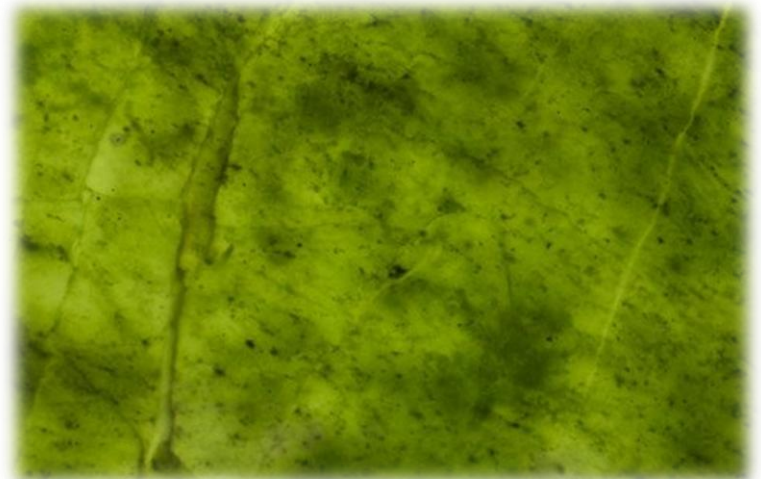
- Take Matua: Key Issue
 - To ensure that resource use and management occurs in a manner consistent with Mana Whenua's vision for Tīkapa Moana / Te Moananui a Toi
 - Whāinga: Objective e.g.
 - Activities in the Tīkapa Moana / Te Moananui ā Toi coastal area only occur when adverse effects are managed, as determined in partnership with Mana Whenua





Methodology

- Wānanga – workshops, roundtables and hui-a-iwi
- Reviews of existing documents, plans and spatial layers
- Development of partner document: He Taonga Papanga Pounamu
